


Suicide

The following graphs and tables show the trends in rates and percentages of suicide for specific age groups in New Zealand 1974-1997.

Key Points


- The suicide rate for the total population has increased steadily over the period. The major contributors to the increase have been the 15-24 and 25-34 year age groups.
- The suicide rate for the 15-24 year age group has been increasing since 1974 with a marked increase in the mid to late 1980s. The 1997 rate was approximately double that of the mid 1980s.
- Within the 15-24 year age group, the suicide rate for 20-24 year olds over the last 5 years of the period, has remained relatively stable whereas the 15-19 year olds' rate increased by approximately two thirds (not shown).

- The suicide rate for the 25-34 year age group has been increasing since 1974 with a marked increase in the rate from 1994. The rate in 1997 was similar to that for the 15-24 year olds.
- The 75+ age group suicide rate was relatively stable up until 1987. There was a substantial decline in the rate over the next three years, and thereafter the rate has remained relatively stable.
- There has been a steady decline over the entire period in the suicide rate for the 55-64 age group. This rate has nearly halved during the period.
- All other age groups (5-14, 35-44, 45-54, 65-74) have had relatively stable suicide rates over the entire period.

Key Points

- The suicide rate for the total population has increased steadily over the period. The major contributors to the increase have been the 15-24 and 25-34 year age groups.
- In 1974, suicides among those aged 15-24, and 25-34 each accounted for approximately 15% of all suicides. By 1997 their contributions had each almost doubled.
- Between 1992 and 1997 the contribution of 15-19 year olds to the percentage of suicides in the 15-24 year age group increased from 33% to 46%.
- Those in the 55-64 age group accounted for 21% of all suicides in 1974. By 1997 this had reduced by two thirds to 7%.
